This article is dedicated to all those people who come to enjoy an event at Amaroo, but also come along as invaluable volunteers.

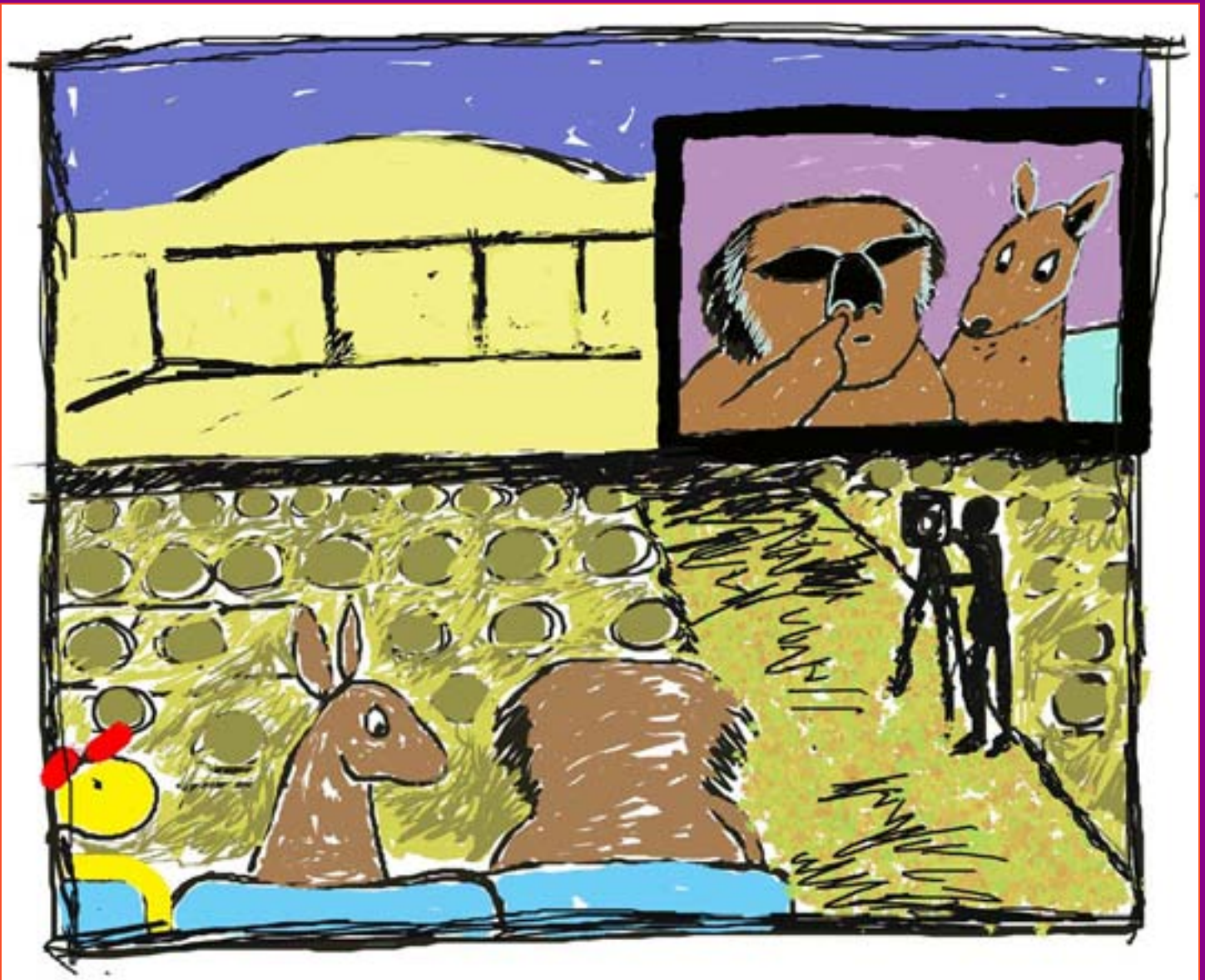

Farm Begins To Yield

The Farm teams efforts have been relentless since September, and the reward... \$100 worth of freshly picked fruit and veggies sold at the last working bee and the 1.2 acre pasture (now christened the 'Big Patch') ready for its first planting! The crew feel great, having turned that full circle, now beginning to earn a small income that will grow and grow and one day help to support Amaroo.

So what have the crew been up to since September?

Check this out:

- Built a bio dynamic compost heap behind the caretakers house, potted some red paw-paw seedlings, mulched the citrus orchard, pulled out cottonweed
- First service of 'china' the tractor, cleaned out the chook shed
- Collected 3 cubic metres of old dry dung from cow paddocks
- Dry cow dung put through a chipper to enrich the soil at the 'small patch'
- Built a cover for the pump to drive water up the hill from the shed tanks (this will then be gravity fed back, to provide pressure for watering)
- Re-plumbed the down pipes to the water tanks (this has worked a treat with rainwater gurgling into the second tank, having already filled the other one to the brim with the recent fab rains)
- Cleared Camp A building gutters to ensure maximum runoff to tanks
- Checked drip irrigation system on the olive grove
- Ploughed the 'Big Patch' six times, spread crusher dust and chook manure, raised the green manure crop and ploughed that back in
- Dug hands into the 'Big Patch' about 10 inches - the result of months of preparation!
- Mowed some neat furrows along and across the 'Big Patch', breaking up the soil as much as possible
- Started building a tractor shed come rest area next to the 'Big Patch'
- Joined in with the fun at the 'Amaroo End Of Year Party'
- Cleared one of the bays in the sheds behind the caretaker's garden to provide a shade/rest area and installed a donated fridge and kettle
- Dug postholes to put another shelter up at the 'Big Patch' (this is where they will take a break from picking their prolific crops of biodynamic vegetables)

If you're interested in a visit, see what's been done, buy some vibrant veggies... the crew are planning a picnic afternoon in mid January. They will provide more details nearer the time.
